

# MOM'S MUSINGS: Dining Out with Youngsters

As any parent of a toddler can tell you, dining out with your child can be a nightmare. My son's lack of patience for sitting still in a restaurant, the mess he makes while eating and the high noise levels at which he operates often leave me sweaty, red-faced and stressed. I often wonder why I pay money to put myself through the headache.

There was a grace period after he was born during which time dining out was pleasant, and he would sleep peacefully in his infant carrier while I enjoyed a meal, and smiled back at the other patrons crooning over my precious, silent newborn. As time went on, the crooning ceased and I became sweatier.

Most of the time, it's easier and more enjoyable for everyone if we simply eat at home. As life gets busier, sometimes the convenience of dining out appeals to me, particularly on nights where I don't feel like cooking and cleaning up afterwards. I also picture Ariel, the little mermaid combing her hair with a fork and tell myself that it's important that my son knows how to conduct himself in a restaurant.

I have summarized some tips that have proven to be effective for me as well as some local restaurants that seem to be kid-friendly.

#### Tips for dining out with kids

I bring a bag of toys that we only play with at restaurants. The novelty of the toys keeps my son's attention longer than the toys he regularly plays with at home. They aren't noisy or messy either, which helps reduce my stress level and I'm guessing — from my days waiting tables — the servers appreciate it too.

I order my son's meal when I place my drink order. Since whatever I order for him usually comes out at 1,000 degrees it allows it extra time to cool off. He's also a slow eater, so that gives him a little longer to finish eating. In the meantime, rather than spending money on an appetizer, I usually give him a smoothie pouch to hold him over and keep him occupied.

We practice using good manners and rehearse placing our orders. This is fun for him and he gets a kick out of the role playing. He usually gets shy again when the server comes, but he can generally squeak out a please and thank you which always makes my mama heart happy.





#### Family-friendly restaurants

The choice of restaurant is crucial. I don't want to set myself up for disaster and I don't want to ruin the dining experience of any other patrons. I choose places that are lively and a little noisy to drown out the animal sounds coming from our table. I also request a booth so I can pen my little guy in.

My top picks when I'm dining with my 3-year-old are:

#### 1. Viva Mexican Restaurant

The margaritas are perfect for me. The kids' meals come with ice cream. The patio is lovely.

#### 2. Gusto

We love pizza, especially the stuff from Gusto. The atmosphere is laid-back, and it's quick, which always helps.

#### 3. Sakari Sushi Lounge

This place is almost always lively, the music is fun, and the service is top notch. The staff seem to enjoy helping to entertain my toddler which is an added bonus.

The most important tip to remember when dining out with wee ones is to cut yourself and your kid some slack. Try to enjoy the meal — and adult beverage — you're paying for and if all else fails, bust out your smart phone and turn on Peppa the Pig — no judgement allowed. ■



## What do i do with all these apples?

You have visited all of central Iowa's apple orchards and pumpkin patches and now you have tons of apples but no idea what to do with them. Sure, an apple a day keeps the doctor away, but can you really eat one a day? There is nothing better than homemade applesauce cooking in a crockpot on a fall day. With these helpful tips, making it can be fun and easy.

#### Supplies

- Apples lots of them buy local.
- Sugar about a cup
- Cinnamon 2 tablespoons more or less depending on preference.
- Water
- Crockpot
- Water bath can be purchased on Amazon.
- Canning kit can be purchased on Amazon or at Walmart.
- Pint mason jars about 8 can be purchased at a local grocery store.

#### Applesauce recipe

When making applesauce, it is really hard to do something wrong. There really is no wrong or right away of doing it. The amount of specific ingredients really matters to each individual, so don't hesitate to add something else such as nutmeg, vanilla or lemon — or omit something such as sugar or water.

- 1. Chop, core and peel about 10 to 12 apples
- 2. Put apples in the crockpot
- 3. Add about 1 cup of water
- 4. Add 1 tablespoon of cinnamon
- 5. Add 1/2 cup sugar
- 6. Let sit for three to four hours or until soft enough to mash.

#### **Canning directions**

- 1. Fill your water bath. You want to make sure there is 1-2 inches of water above your mason jars.
- 2. Wash your mason jars. I placed mine in the dishwasher and pulled them out when they were nice and hot.
- 3. Boil your lids and rings.

- 5. Use your magnetic lid lifter from your canning kit to place the lid on top of the jar.
- 6. Use the jar wrench to tighten the ring on.
- 7. Place into water bath, making sure they are all covered with 1-2 inches
- 8. Begin to boil the water (you can start boiling your water while you are filling your jars and placing the lids).
- 9. For applesauce you want to boil for 15 minutes.
- 10. Once finished remove from hot bath and place on towel.
- 11. Let sit for at least 12 hours.
- 12. You may hear popping that means your lids are sealing. After the 12 hours — probably before — you can test the lids by pressing the center and they should not flex up and down.




